We can also speed up processes, such as copying a pattern or make complicated tasks easier, such as flipping or rotating a picture. We can also use tools, such as zoom to add detail to our artwork. Digital artwork tools also allow us to undo a mistake instead of starting it all again.

Vocabulary	Definition
Rotation	Turn an object or objects to point in a different direction
Zoom	Move closer to the art work, to add detail
Flip	Make an object face the opposite way, this can be done vertically (left to right/right to left) or horizontally (up to down/down to up)
Symmetry	Copy an object or picture to make it the same on both sides
Duplicate	Make or create an exact copy
Repeat	Repeating the same image or pattern over and over again

Golden vocabulary

Tools	Anything that is used to make a change to something else or to help complete a job.
Patterns	A repeated decorative design.
Colour wheel	Colours arranged in a circle, to show how each colour is related to one another.
Undo	If a tool is used in a design, but you would like to return to the previous state of the design, you can reverse the changes.
