Outcome:

An informative poster using the skill of collage.

This half term, the children will explore the work of the charitable organisation, Fairtrade. They will use their map skills to locate where specific crops are grown, discover how they can help farmers in developing countries and think about how they could become involved in supporting this charity.

Furthermore, they will learn about the technique of collage and use this to produce an informative poster about Fairtrade.

Maths:

Ratio: use ratio language; introduction to the ratio symbol; ratio and fractions; scale drawing; use scale factors; similar shapes; ratio problems; proportion problems; recipes.

Algebra: 1 and 2 step function machines; form expressions; substitution; formulae; form equations; solve 1 and 2 step equations; find pairs of values; solve problems with two **unknowns**

Decimals: place value; rounding; addition and subtraction; multiplying and dividing

Science:

Light:

How we see; light and straight lines; shadow formation; investigating shadows; refraction; explore light.

English:

Diary writing as a Fairtrade worker:

Skills: figurative language (similes/personification/alliteration); informal tone; expression of thoughts and feelings.

Information/explanation text about mountain:

Skills: facts; technical vocabulary; parenthesis; formal tone; using a variety of sentence lengths and structures for impact.
